<u>NaturalReader</u>- Free version available. Can read PDFs, web pages, e-books, and printed material out loud. Available for both Mac and PCs. Speed and voice are adjustable. Use the floating bar to read Canvas

Read & Write, \$145/year. Free for students registered with the Office of Disability Services with this accommodation. Also available for tablet and Chrome browsers. This application has both text-to-speech and speech-to-text abilities. This is the program used in our Office of Disability Services testing room and is on the library computers.

<u>Voice Dream Reader</u>- \$14.99 in the app store. Text-to-speech assistive app for both Apple and Android. Reads PDF, EPUB, DAISY text, Microsoft Word and Power Point, Web, and Plain Text.
