






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

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

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1, Section 34A-6-307 is amended to read:

34A-6-307. Civil and criminal penalties.

- (1) (a) The commission may assess civil penalties against an employer who has received a citation under Section 34A-6-302 as follows:
 - (i) except as provided in Subsections (1)(a)(ii) through (1)(a)(iv), the commission may assess up to \$13,653.\$16,131. for each cited violation:
 - (ii) the commission may not assess more than \$13,653 \$16,131 for each accessious violation;
 - (iii) the commission may not assess less than \$9,753 \$11,518 nor more than \$136,532 \$161,323 for each cited willful violation;
 - (iv) the commission may assess up to \$136,532 \$161,323 for each cited violation if the employer has previously been found to have violated the same standards, code, rule, or order; and
 - (v) after the expiration of the time permitted to an employer to correct a cited violation, the commission may assess up to \$13,653 \$16,131 for each day the violation continues uncorrected.
