

Emergency Medical Technician Licensure and Disclosure

Welcome to <u>Snow College's Emergency Medical Technician Certificate!</u> Snow College's EMT program prepares you for certification through the <u>National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT)</u> and the <u>Utah Department of Health and Human Services Office of Emergency Medical Services and Preparedness.</u> Snow College is accredited by the <u>Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU).</u>

Because emergency medical technicians require licensure, it is recommended that all students are familiar with the requirements posted on the <u>Utah Department of Health and Human Services</u>

<u>Office of Emergency Medical Services and Preparedness</u> website or similar agencies within the state of interest.

There are four different levels of testing offered through NREMT: EMR, EMT, AEMT, and Paramedic. As part of these exams, there are two portions: Cognitive and Psychomotor. Snow College recommends that you complete both exam types to maintain eligibility for licensure across state boundaries.

Utah is a member of the **EMS Compact**. Member states of this compact allow personnel to practice across state lines. It is your responsibility to apply for licensure in compact member states.

Applicants should have a valid, current NREMT certification.

Each state has set their own standards for licensure that are independent of graduating from Snow College. States may require additional course work or professional training. Below is contact information for licensing boards for US States and Territories. Snow College does not monitor the licensing requirements for non-US States and Territories.
